## Coalition to slash red tape on 457 visas

The newly-elected Coalition Government has vowed to remove 'red tape' on 457 visas as the business community steps up demands for the reversal of the previous Government's crackdown on the scheme that brings foreign skilled workers to Australia.

The Minister for Immigration and Border Protection, Scott Morrison, recently indicated that, "We strongly opposed

these measures in opposition and will be consulting on how best to cut red tape on 457 visas, while maintaining legitimate protections that support the integrity of the scheme."
